PowerSchool Update Parent/Teacher Conferences

Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled for **Wed**, **Nov. 03 and Thurs**, **Nov. 04**. They will run 4pm-8pm. We are set up with **Conference Manager** through School Soft, and you will be able to start booking your appointment times today (Friday) at 3pm. Please see the attached paper to help you with set-up! We would love to see you all there!

There will not be a midterm report card sent out to students. Instead, parents and students are encouraged to check their PowerSchool for their up-to-date marks in all of their courses. Report cards will be sent home at the end of the first semester in January. Parents are encouraged to check PowerSchool frequently to see how their child is doing in their classes.

TCHS Course Write up

In light of the fact that report cards won't be sent out (students and parents can check grades on powerschool as the note on page 1 suggests), we are including a brief write up of activities / learning content covered in various courses through our first quarter.

<u>Math 10C:</u> Students have covered 3 units in Mathematics 10C. Students have learned how to determine the surface area and volume of 3-D objects. As well, students have learned how to solve measurement problems using SI and imperial units. Finally, students learned how to simplify expressions that involve powers with integral and rational exponents and how to simplify or factor polynomial expressions.

<u>Math 10-3:</u> Students have covered 4 units in Mathematics 10-3. Students have learned how to solve linear and area measurement problems for 2-D shapes and 3-D objects using SI and imperial units. As well, students have learned how to solve capacity, volume, mass and temperature problems using SI and imperial units.

<u>Math 10-4</u>: Students have covered 2 units in Mathematics 10-4. Students have learned how to solve problems using whole numbers, decimals, and fractions.

Social Studies 20: The theme for Social 20 is Nationalism. In the first quarter, we have spent time looking at nationalism in a Canadian context. We have explored related topics such as patriotism and group identity as well. We have also been exploring how nationalism developed during the French Revolution and are currently exploring the development of Japanese nationalism in the late 1800's / early 1900's.

Science 10: We have just finished our chemistry unit and will be writing a unit exam next week. In chemistry we looked at the properties and structure of matter at its most basic level, the atom. We studied the structure of the atom and how different elements and compounds result from different structures and relationships. Our next unit will be our physics unit, where we get an introduction to motion, forces, and energy transfer.

Science 14: We have just completed our chemistry unit and will be writing a unit exam next week. In chemistry, we learned to describe the properties of matter (both physical and chemical) on a particle level. We learned the basics of naming elements and compounds, and then moved into a study of chemical reactions in our everyday lives.

Science 24: We have just completed our chemistry unit, where we studied chemical reactions in our lives. We learned about different types of chemical reactions and where they occur in our day-to-day lives. We studied how those chemical reactions can help make life easier, and how some chemical reactions can be harmful to our health and to the environment. We concluded the unit with a look at why Christians should care about the environment.

Physics 20: We have just completed our unit in Kinematics. In this unit we studied motion (displacement, velocity, and acceleration) in 1and 2-dimensions, as well as gravitational acceleration and projectile motion. Our next unit, Dynamics, will focus on Newton's Laws of Motion, which describe how forces act on objects and influence their motion.

English 20: The main objective of English 20 is to develop student's ability to comprehend, develop, and present ideas and information in the English language. In the first quarter, we have studied, analyzed, and created forms of slam poetry, podcasts, speeches, and song. We are also currently studying *A Tale of Two Cities* by Charles Dickens, which focuses on themes of resurrection, restoration, and transformation and is set in the late eighteenth century. Students have created personal and critical responses to demonstrate their comprehension and ability to present information to their audience.

PE 10: The main objective of PE 20 is to enable our students to develop their unique talents and gifts to lead a healthy and active lifestyle for life. In the first quarter, students have had the opportunity to develop their skills and fitness through including neuromuscular training and other physical activities through wide games, soccer, ultimate frisbee, volleyball and x-country running. In PE 10, we have focused on the importance of a positive attitude and giving a strong effort and participation in all activities.

PE 20: The main objective of PE 20 is to enable our students to develop their unique talents and gifts to lead a healthy and active lifestyle for life. In the first quarter, students have had the opportunity to develop their skills and fitness through exercises including neuromuscular training and other physical activities through wide games, soccer, ultimate frisbee, volleyball and x-country running. A point of emphasis in the first quarter has been communication, teamwork, and team strategy.

Spanish 10: The overall objective of Spanish 10 is to learn the foundational knowledge, skills and strategies to effectively use Spanish in a variety of situations and purposes. In the first quarter, we have studied letters of the alphabet, common greetings and expressions, months and days of the year, basic numbers places of the city, common AR verbs. We have also explored Spanish culture through listening to Spanish songs and simple short stories.

<u>Christian Studies 15</u>: The focus for Christian Studies 15 is the Old Testament. Alongside going through the Old Testament, we pay special attention to the context of the writing and the themes that run throughout God's Story as found in Scripture. Special emphasis is paid to the Creation – Fall – Redemption – Restoration narrative as a way of relating to and tying together all the different stories in the Bible.

Psychology 20: Students have been introduced to the field of study called Psychology. They have learned about the different branches of psychology ranging from child psychology to neuroscience. Students have gained insight into how the human body develops over a person's lifespan. As well, students have learned what intelligence is and how it is measured. Through the study of psychology, students have gained insight into their own behaviour, intelligence, and the unique person that God has created them to be.

Baking Basics: Students have learned about the various equipment required for baking, kitchen safety, the role of key baking ingredients, the correct preparation methods for the production of a variety of baked goods (muffin, biscuit, and cake methods), and how to differentiate among the various categories of cookies. Students have made cheese biscuits and banana oat muffins.

<u>Construction 1010</u>: Students are learning the basics about wood project construction, tools, and common fastening techniques. Students have a chance to put their learning into action by constructing a picnic table.
