













Principal's Message - Jason Visser

I am wondering if you have ever heard of a person named Qin Shi Huang? Anyone? Hmm. To be fair, he is someone who lived many years ago on the other side of the planet (relative to us). Emperor Qin Shi Huang came to rule China in the year 246 BC ...that is 246 years before the time of Christ. He was 13 years old at this time. He was the first person to start building the Great Wall of China, a wall that stretches close to 9000 km's across northern China. Emperor Qin also decided to build himself a huge tomb. Inside this tomb are over 1500 lifelike clay soldiers (he originally wanted soldiers buried with him to create a proper sense of mourning, but was talked out of this by his advisors). There are also over 200 life size clay chariots. The truth is that the school is a reminder of how God has blessed us and an encouragement to continue to serve him out of a sense of calling and a sense of gratitude.




