- A Note regarding the Grade 9 Exam schedule: Grade 9s are in regular classes until Friday June 13. June 16, they have no school since no exams are offered on this day. June 17/18, they have a PAT in the morning. They are given free time after they are finished writing the exam, however, they are expected to be here in the afternoon for review for their PAT the next day. On Thursday, the 19th, Grade 9s are writing their last PAT in the morning. In the afternoon, they will be going to Taber MD Park for activities! Please note that this is the last day that they need to come to school!
- Grade 10-12 students only need to come into school on the days that they have scheduled exams.
- Please note that there will continue to be a morning transfer bus from TCS to TCHS but there is NO afternoon transfer bus. Horizon buses will run like normal. The Burdett and Vauxhall bus will also run like normal.

TCHS Student Community Volunteer Hours








Students of the Month
